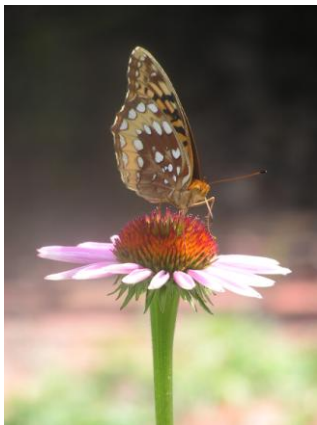

Course: The Frisco Highline Trail is the second longest rail trail in Missouri. The Wildflower Ride is a metric century ride (**62 miles**) beginning at the Bolivar Trailhead south to Willard, turnaround and return. The course will host a panoramic view of the Ozarks in full bloom with 16 bridges, La Petite Gem Prairie, and **four rest stop locations**. The trail is a crushed limestone surface and is self-supported (no sag), be prepared to fix your own flats, etc.

REGISTRATION FEE: \$25 pre-registration on-line or by mail or \$30 day of the ride, however, additional donations are greatly appreciated. Registration table opens at 6:30 a.m. and the ride begins at 8:00 a.m. All participants will receive a commemorative T-shirt.
